## Latest Village Hall Improvements



A lot has been happening at the Hall recently - you may have noticed a skip outside the last few weeks.

We have had to have the flooring under the old kitchen removed - replacing all the joists and floorboards as they had completely rotted through with damp. This has been a main priority for the committee to get fixed as it was a health and safety risk. We are pleased to say it is now done and ready to be sanded and varnished in the next few weeks - this was all possible due to funding received through the Build Back Better Councillor Scheme and the Community Infrastructure Levy fund - so a massive thank you for this.









I'm sure you will agree that it all looks a lot smarter - and safer!

It does mean that we now don't have a kitchen - but we intend to install a temporary one so any hirers will still have access to a sink, microwave and kettle etc.

If there are an qualified electricians or plumbers willing to volunteer and help install a small commerical stainless steel sink and heater that would be great!

#### So what are our next steps?

We need to repair the stone mullion window surrounds and frames as these are currently letting out a lot of heat

Replace our current heating system to a more effective and economical one (before winter sets in!)

Put a new kitchen into the store room

All of these are extremely expensive, so unfortunately can't be done straight away - however, the committee are currently applying for more funding through a number of grants. Applications have been submitted and more will be made over the next few months.

The process is slow and involved but we hope to be able to raise some of the funds to start the windows next.

## In The Garden



Summer 2024 – a bit of a wash out but look on the bright side; not too much watering to be done!

In Both early May and June we had a scorcher of a day – too hot to do much, but the rest of the months were poor. On the positive front the garden loved it. Everything was blooming and the greens were lush. The grass grew madly and finding a dry day to cut it proved interesting!

The saying goes 'Oak before Ash, a bit of a splash. Ash before Oak, we're in for a soak'. But the Oak was in full leaf before the Ash this year so no-one told mother nature. All trees, now fully leaved, look lovely and cooling on the those few hot, sunny days,

Late June and everything started growing. Beetroot, Onions, Runners, all shot up; Strawberries ripened and Red & Black currants too. The roses were full of flower and some are still blooming now. Herbaceous perennials shot up and flowered profusely. Geraniums and Geums had their 'Chelsea Chop' and have rewarded me with another mass of flowers.

July started as a bit of a washout, and chilly! But the sun has shown its face a few times and the garden is blooming regardless. Oddly the onions started to rot at their bases even though the ground was dry so they had to come out but this gave room for the Cauliflowers and Broccoli that were straining in large pots. Some late rows of chard and I'm set up for the early part of the winter and into February with the broccoli.

The 'late' summer flowers are now filling the garden. Verbena, Buddleia, Lavender, Alliums, and the climbing roses still going strong. And getting ready for later are the Sedum and the plums.

If anyone should want some Sedum 'Autumn Glory' please ask; mine grow madly and I'l have to split them this year to stop them taking over!

### FANCY GOING ON A LOCAL WALK?

Nigel Bone has kindly shared details of a local walk you may want to try:



#### **Brookthorpe / Harescombe (3 miles approx.)**

- 1. From Fagins, walk a few hundred yards up Horspools Hill.
- 2. Approaching Styles Lane look out for public footpath sign on the right. Go over the stile and walk diagonally across the field to another stile.
  - 3. Go over over the stile cross the road; go over another stile.
  - 4. Follow the hedge on the right until you come to a stile go over it.
    - 5. Follow the hedge (now on your left) until reaching a footbridge
- 6. Cross the footbridge and follow the path across 2 fields until you reach a farm gate which is opposite Harescombe Church.

#### STOP FOR BREAK

- 7. From the church follow the road fort about 100 yards until you see a footpath sign on the right.
  - 8. Follow the path down some steps and into the field.
  - 9. Turn right and then straight on keeping the hedge on your right.
- 10. After ½ mile or so after crossing some stiles you will come to Daniels Brook Cottage.
- 11. Cross over Haresfield Lane via a stile follow the line of Daniels Brook on your right.
- 12. Cross a footbridge on your right; then turn left which will take you to another stile.
  - 13. Make for metal gate a few hundred yards across the field.
  - 14. Go through the gate and turn left make for kissing gate.
  - 15. Go right through the kissing gate; head for another gate.
  - 16. Go through the gate; then another kissing gate which leads to St.Swithun's churchyard.
    - 17. Come into Stroud Road turning right which will bring you back to Fagins.
