CoppaFeel 5 Day Trek to the Himalyas - Kate Hughes

On 9th November I fly out to the Indian Himalayas to take part in a challenging 5 day trek for the charity CoppaFeel with 120 other people, including a number of celebrities. My team captain is Emma Willis, other celebrities taking part are Giovanna Fletcher, Sara Davies, Angela Scanlon and Olympian Erins Kennedy.



CoppaFeel is an amazing charity which raises awareness of breast cancer, especially in young people to stop late diagnosis and give everyone the best chance of survival.

This is going to be particularly challenging, both mentally and physically for me as I was diagnosed with Stage 2 Grade 2 breast cancer in January 2023, and subsequently had surgery to remove the tumour and my lymph nodes, 5 months of chemotherapy and 15 sessions of radiotherapy before I received the all clear! We moved to Brookthorpe in July 2023 in the middle of my treatment.

Any donations for CoppaFeel would be absolutely amazing and they all help motivate me to get out there and get moving!

Latest Village Hall Improvements



Progress on the Hall has slowed down whilst we try and raise more funds.

Our next big job is to repair the stone mullion window surrounds and frames as these are currently letting out a lot of heat. We then need to replace our current heating system to a more effective and economical one. All of this ideally before it gets too cold, as the Hall really does lose a lot of heat and is not great when we need to hire it out all year round.

Unfortunately we have not been successful with our National Lottery application. We were asking for a lot, so knew this would be a challenge especially with so many other organisations/ charities etc needing help too. However, we remain positive and will keep trying to raise funds, albeit smaller amounts - which means things will have to be done in stages with the most important being done first.

If anyone knows of any funding/grant opportunities or would like to lend a hand in helping raise the funds, please do let us know as we are only a committee of 4 now, so any extra help is always welcome.

Some good news though - we now have a temporary kitchen which is working well and means we have been able to hire out the hall on many occassions since we had the floor done.

In The Garden



Well, what a summer! Hot, cold, wet, dry. Some things loved it and others not so much.

Generally apples did well, as did the plums, but the pears had nothing on them! Obviously something was missing this spring!

Many plants seemed to do their 'thing' very quickly but also re-flowered later in the season. The roses are still trying now in mid October.

The sedum are HUGE and flowering madly; covered in bees and hover-flies.

The broccoli is doing well, the cauliflower not so much; possibly too close together but the sheep enjoy the outer leaves. They may be getting more!

I had a good crop of tomatoes in the greenhouse, for that all important tomato salad (just add salt and olive oil), and I've taken to growing little cucumbers; they are prolific and ripen much quicker than the big ones AND don't go squishy in the fridge quite so quickly!

Now is the time for bulbs. Snowdrops, crocus, daffs, tulips, iris, allium, garlic, onions. Get as many in as possible, wherever you can. In the garden or in pots. They are one of the first things to appear in Spring, giving you that glimpse of the year to come; hope for the year ahead and confirmation that life is just under ground, ready to burst forth.

Wrap up warm and enjoy the nights in front of the fire. Plan your garden for next year and hopefully you've planted *something* to look at during the darker months!

Blocked Public Rights of Way

Unfortunately the situation with the blocking of EBR 25 and EBR 26 continues despite the Parish Council's best efforts. These blockings effect both landowners who cannot access their land and members of the public who legitimately wish to use the Public Right of Way.

Efforts are continuing with regular Multi Agency meetings taking place to try to find a solution.

Upton Lane

It appears that there are fewer large lorries using Upton Lane to access the building site at Matson. However, the problem with speeding continues. The Parish council are working with the Police on this matter.

Local Plan and Whaddon Fields

The Parish Council has until 23rd October to reply to consultation on junctions 12 and 14 on the M5 in relation to housing increase projected and the new targets under NPFF.

National Rail want to know the timeline for the closing of the level crossing at Naas Lane which is part of the S.23/2428/OUT application. They require the Public Right of Way to be closed before any occupation of the new home take place. They also require that the agreement with Network Rail is looked at before making use of the bridge for pedestrian use.

Clerk to the Parish Council

After 21 years of serving the Parish as Clerk to the Parish Council I am standing down at the end of November. A new Clerk has been appointed (please see next page).

It has been a privilege to serve your community and hope that a new Clerk will enjoy the position as I have over the years.

The Parish Council meeting on Tuesday 5th November will be the final meeting that the Clerk to the Parish Council Anne Szabo will be undertaking before her retirement at the end of November.

Anne has been our Clerk for 21 years, commencing her employment on 1st July 2003. She has been an able Clerk and has kept the Parish Council in good order and ensured that we are always operating and making decisions within the legal framework that Parish Councils are required to operate.

During her time there have been some major issues, inevitably around Planning Applications that have been very time consuming. The M5 Services being one, the Travellers site at Mount View, Nass Lane (a site that continues to have issues), and of course the proposed Whaddon Housing Development of 2500/3000 homes.

The Parish Council wish Anne all the best in her retirement.

Fortunately, the Parish Council has a replacement Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer starting employment on the 1st November. Tina Balgobin has previous experience as a Parish Clerk and is familiar to the workings of a Parish Council and we wish her all the best in her new appointment.

St Swithun's Church

A meeting was held at the Village Hall on the evening on Wednesday 16 th .October at the Village Hall which was attended by a number of people living in the parish together with Meriel O'Dowd and Isobel Milne from the Churches Conservation Trust (CCT).

The purpose was to discuss long term aims for the building, ways of raising the necessary funds (estimated at £1.3million) to restore it to a good state of repair and also raising awareness of the needs of the church to the locality and wider area.

The CCT had commissioned a full structural survey, work on which had already begun.

It was noted that the church had been closed for some time due to safety issues – it was felt that firstly efforts should be made to try to organise some events.

As a first step in this direction, it was decided to try to organise a Christmas Carol Service on Wednesday 11 th December commencing 7.00pm.

As the church will not have been cleaned for some time, it will be necessary to have a working party to carry this out. It was suggested that this should take place during the day on **Wednesday 4 th December**. I would ask that if anyone has some spare time on that day – please come along around 10.00am.

Carol Services in the church have been held on many occasions in the past and have been both well attended and enjoyed by those who have come along. Events don't just happen – they require effort and commitment from those in the community. Could I ask that everyone gives this some thought – both in terms of the cleaning preparatory work and the composition of the service. For the latter we need people to read lessons, recite appropriate poems or contribute music. Most of all, I feel, we require contributions from children and young people.

Please get in touch with me if you can help or have any ideas.

Let's hope we can achieve a successful event for the whole community.
